Board and Officer Report:

The NE OL Board of Directors met prior to the State Committee meeting. Those in attendance were: Carol Daley, Marv Kohout, Deb Ashworth, Christine Saxon, Taylor Kelley, Rich Kotan, and Billy Anderson. Not present were Dan Chapp and David Huntley. The items discussed were the modifications of the By-Laws to add another member. The Board consists of one person from the FRA, 8 members (we had 7), and the Executive Director. The Director and FRA are non-voting for a total of 9 members on the Board. Carol wants everyone that can attend the Highway Rail Safety Conference in Blue Springs (KCY) on March 18 and 19 Carol cancelled her internet, fax line, and phone which will save us \$160 per month. She will be using her cell phone (402) 657-0439 for calls. Carol did report after reviewing finances that NAC Expenses and State Coordinator Travel Expenses have not been reimbursed and she is expecting them anytime.

Treasurer:

Balance on hand as of October 31, 2019 was \$10,750 in checking.

Nebraska Operation Lifesaver had a special guest speaker today. Stu Sutherland invited John Nicely from WOW, and the guest speaker who filmed a documentary on staying safe at railroad crossings. The film was excellent, and John showed it on TV in his segment, Nicely Done. Carol was going to promote this to the National office to give Sam and

John Senser more audience recognition. Sam has won several film awards and we were very excited to have him present at our meeting.

Old Business:

Carol's Update:

Carol stated that if all of Region 6 states get in their end of year reports Region 6 would get \$1500 in administrative grant. Carol also explained the Postner Grant which each state gets up to \$500 to reimburse an OLAV got expenses spent doing Operation Lifesaver presentations but recipient to grant much supply receipts and pictures of the event.

Carol also provided an update on the State Coordinator meeting in Houston, Texas which included the new GCCI course now named Railroad Investigation and Safety Course (RISC). Jeff Schmid commented on the fact that police generally do not have many occasions to handle railroad incidents and since trains are not a motor vehicle it is important that they understand how to handle these situations. Module 1 is a stand alone and is targeted to all first responders. Modules 2, 3 and 4 must be taught together.

Carol invited interested Nebraska OL representatives that want to attend the 2020 KS/MO/NE/IA Highway Rail Safety Conference can sign up and she will reimburse anyone from Nebraska their registration costs.

Media - New National Website

Megan updated about the new Operation Lifesaver website and how the website is laid out. The old website will still be available until the website testing has been completed. Roger suggested that the Railroad Locater Ap would be a good application for everyone on our team.

By-Law Update

Rich updated that new By-Laws will be completed by next meeting to accommodate the additional Board Member voted in January 2019 due to the voting tie and that this addition to the By-Laws had been approved by the board. Carol updated that our By-Laws had been updated to include 10 members on the Board. The Executive Director (Carol) and FRA member are non-voting members, and there are two members from the railroad (BNSF Railroad which is Dan Chapp) and UP Railroad which is Deb Ashworth and 6 at large board members. Rich Kotan will have ballots ready for March voting.

Enforcement Manual updates

Rich stated this was an ongoing project.

2019 Raffle

Carol advised that our 2019 fundraiser has earned \$2.097.87 after paying expenses of \$1,152.34. The expenses included paying for the footballs, volleyballs, framing of Greg Garrett's pictures, Tom Osborn signatures of \$20 each which goes to his charity for a total of \$1,152.34. Carol also stated that we use the raffle money for expenses for our two trailers. We do have a crash car that we can use to get our rail messages out which we did utilize at the State Fair this year. Although we no longer have phone and internet expenses due to Carol shutting it down and using her own personal internet, we will have a storage unit cost for the Operation Lifesaver supplies.

New Business

Problem Solving Grade Crossing issues – Dave Huntley will be reviewed at our January meeting.

Nebraska Rail Safety Week was a huge success thanks to Roger Figard helping us get the Governor to sign the state proclamation and the City of Lincoln/Lancaster County. Carol was also able to get the City of Waverly.

Operation Lifesaver Launches Redesigned Website

WASHINGTON, DC, November 8, 2019 – Operation Lifesaver Inc., the national, non-profit rail safety education group, has launched its redesigned website (www.oli.org) to reach new audiences and further its mission of preventing tragic deaths and injuries on or near train tracks. The completely redesigned site, which is maximized for an improved user experience on mobile devices, gives visitors an immediate sense of the organization's lifesaving mission and offers simplified site navigation.

"The new oli.org is visually more appealing, easier to navigate and designed for optimal viewing whether the visitor is using a laptop, desktop or mobile device. We made it our priority to meet accessibility standards and create easily identifiable resources that are only a click away for our website visitors and rail safety partners," said Operation Lifesaver Executive Director **Rachel Maleh.**

"The design incorporates our vision for a website that makes an immediate impression on first-time visitors while improving navigation for our existing audiences," noted Maleh.

New features on the website include:

- **Simplified main navigation** through four main categories, including a dropdown "Info for" feature to quickly locate resources for key audiences including kids, first responders, law enforcement, media, new drivers and others.
- A new "Safety Near Trains" section with links to track safety basics, background on Operation Lifesaver's public awareness campaigns and other rail safety information.
- A new "Track Statistics" section, which offers statistics on railroad crossing collisions and pedestrian trespassing from the Federal Railroad Administration as well as quick facts on rail safety and Operation Lifesaver's efforts.
- A new Materials Library accessible by a link at the bottom of each page, which offers a central location for visitors to find free and downloadable rail safety resources sorted by media type, material type, audience and topic.

Major funding for the redesign was obtained from grants via the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA).

"We are grateful to our safety partners at the FRA, FTA, FHWA and the U.S. Department of Transportation for making this redesign possible," Maleh concluded.

About Operation Lifesaver

Operation Lifesaver is a nonprofit public safety education and awareness organization dedicated to reducing collisions, fatalities and injuries at highway-rail crossings and preventing trespassing on or near railroad tracks. A national network of trained volunteers gives free presentations on rail safety and a public awareness campaign, "See Tracks? Think Train!" provides tips and statistics to encourage safe behavior near the

Notes for State Coordinators from the State Coordinator Regional Representative's Meeting
Houston, September, 2019

Yellow highlights = action items

Greetings State Coordinators: The NAC Meeting was facilitated by Co-Chairs Jessica Feder, Indiana OL and Steve Covey, Canadian National Railway and OLI BOD member.

Chantez Bailey announced that there are plans for a soft launch of the redesigned OLI website in September.

Wende Corcoran reviewed Federal Grants announcing that FRA grants will continue and funding for FHWA grants over the next 5 years has been granted.

Jessica and Steve gave an update on the Railroad Investigation and Safety Course (RISC) which will replace the current GCCI course. The new product will have a cohesive structure in a PowerPoint format with new videos. There will be four modules of 1 hour each. Module 1 may stand alone and is aimed at all First Responders. Modules 2, 3, and 4 must be taught together. The Material Review Committee has reviewed the materials and submitted suggested revisions. There will be a soft rollout in January, 2020. Two pilot classes will be conducted from September to November. The existing GCCI course will be retired in June, 2020.

Chantez gave an update on Rail Safety Week. She reported that the testimonial videos in long and short forms along with Social Media Posts will be released daily according to the Schedule of Messages and Events. Operation Clear Track will once again be held on Tuesday, September 24 with over 600 agencies registered nationwide. Remember to use the hashtags #RailSafetyWeek and #STOPTrackTragedies when posting on social media platforms. Some RSW materials were emailed to you by Rachel and others may be found at http://bit.ly/rswmats.

Debra "Dee" Chappel from the FRA reported that the new FRA Staff Director is James Payne. She gave an overview of statistics and trends. Current Hot Topics for the FRA are 1) Train Horn/Quiet Zones, 2) Blocked Crossings and 3) State Action Plans (which must be submitted by all states). She encouraged state OL programs to be involved in the creation of this plan. Dee also reported that Operation Lifesaver will be featured under "Special Topics" in the new Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Handbook. Her PowerPoint will be available once received by OLI.

Wende reported that there will be eight Regional Workshops scheduled in the first three quarters of 2020 coinciding with FRA Summits when possible. These workshops will be

attended by state coordinators, OLI and FRA staff. She also announced that there is a tentative plan to hold a Leadership Conference after Rail Safety Week in 2020. Stay tuned for more information and dates. Wende reported that plans for a 2022 Celebration of the 50th Anniversary of Operation Lifesaver are being discussed.

<u>Following the NAC meeting – the State Coordinator Regional Representatives held their</u> meeting with OLI Staff and BOD members.

OLI BOD member John Walsh of Genesee & Wyoming gave an OLI Treasurer's Report as seen below:

- The Board approved the filing of the IRS Form 990.
 - o It was prepared by Rositzka, Wicks and Company.
 - o The Form 990 is an income tax return for non-profits.
 - Once accepted by the IRS, it is publicly available.
- The Board also approved the draft 2018 audit report for filing with our federal funders later this month.
 - There were no findings.
 - The auditor stated that OLI is making "steady progress".
 - After two years of "clean" audits, OLI will be eligible to participate in the Combined Federal Campaign. This will allow for federal employees to select OLI as a non-profit to receive payroll deductions.
- A budget reforecast was completed in July.
 - It is a standard accounting practice to look at actual spend for the first half of the year compared to projections.
 - Another driver was the FHWA grant timing. We expected it to be full year, but it was just awarded in August. The prorated funds will be pushed into 2020.
- OLI expects to keep its cash reserve intact through the end of the year. We also expected to maintain a positive operating cash position through year end.
- Private contributions have increased.

OLI BOD member Andy Elkins of AAR reported that the USA has been asked to host ILCAD in 2021. AAR, FRA, and NHTSA are in discussions about the possibility of hosting the meetings. Stay tuned for updates.

Rachel Maleh told the SCRRs that she feels a positive environment within the OL family. She was excited to announce that VA is the newest OL program. Discussions are being had about Maryland and D.C. She reported that the OLI staff attended the 2019 National Highway - Rail Grade Crossing Safety Conference in Pittsburgh, Aug. 19-22. Rachel addressed the group with an update on Operation Lifesaver and its mission and highlighted state activities from those states who submitted information to her. She encouraged increased communication of activities between the state and national offices. A pdf of her presentation is viewable on the State Coordinator Dashboard.

Rachel reminded states that the deadline to submit requests for volunteer travel provided by the Posner Family Foundation of Pittsburg Grant is November 20, 2019. Details are below under 2019 Grant Information.

F. Tom Roberts Volunteer Award Committee Chairman Doug Farler reported that he will send out a "Call for Nominations" in late September. The deadline for nominations will be October 18 and the state coordinator of the winning state will be alerted by November 8 so that the winner may be honored at a state year-end meeting if the coordinator so desires. The winner will also be honored as the 2018 Winner at the 2020 Leadership Conference.

Please consider submitting an application to honor an outstanding Volunteer in your state.

All candidates will be recognized when the winner is announced.




